WORLD CHALLENGE EXPEDITION SUCCESS - Malawi

In July fifteen pupils from U5, L6 and U6 took part in the Bradford Girls' Grammar School World Challenge expedition to Malawi. The trip which ran for one month sought to widen pupil's experience whilst giving back to the local Malawi community.

The expedition involved two main phases; the first was a gruelling six day trek on the Mulanje Massive – the tallest mountain range in central and eastern Africa culminating in Sapitwa Peak at 3002 metres. The second was the project phase where Bradford Girls' Grammar School pupils helped to build a teacher's house and reorganise and redecorate the library and classrooms at Kaphirintiwa Secondary School in the Salima District of Malawi.

Mrs Rimmer and Mrs Jackson believe the experience has been life changing for the pupils involved. Indeed parents have said that their daughters have returned "much more mature."

Mrs Rimmer said "girls from Bradford Girls' Grammar School took part in World Challenge to gain life experience through travel and to give back to the world in which they live. They were aware that the children from Malawi live in very poor conditions but it's quite different when seen in real life. Some of them live in the school itself or in simple shelters dotted around the village. Many are orphans because of HIV.

There was no electricity – which means no ipods, telephones or computers. There were many days when we didn't know what we were going to eat. It puts an interesting perspective on what we see as important"

As a result of the trip, Bradford Girls' Grammar School and the Starfish Malawi charity have collaborated to set up a permanent link between the schools through the British Council - this means that Bradford Girls' Grammar School will continue to support Kaphirintiwa Secondary and Chitalq Primary Schools with donations, shared curriculum, and future visits.

Mrs Rimmer will return to the Salima District on 17th October for a further two weeks and has so far collected donations of clothing, sports equipment, books and stationery. A further £150.00 has been raised though a preparatory school bun sale which will pay for transporting the equipment and signs for the re-furbished library.

Bradford Girls' Grammar School will return to Kaphirintiwa School in summer 2012 for the Next World Challenge.

Yorkshire & England Cricketer, Michael Vaughan visits Bradford Girls' Grammar School



On Wednesday 28th July, the hugely successful cricketer, Michael Vaughan OBE visited the King's Camps Michael Vaughan Cricket Coaching Week at Bradford Girls' Grammar School. Vaughan is a former cricketer who represented Yorkshire England. He is greatly remembered for being captain of the England team when they beat Australia in the 2005 Ashes, England's first Ashes victory since 1986/7. In addition, Vaughan captained England in 51 Tests between 2003 and 2008, winning 26 (a national record).

The Cricket Academy took place during the week of 26-30 July. This innovative coaching course provides a great introduction to cricket and develops the cricket skills and techniques of children with a basic skill level.
