














THE SERVANTS HIDE JULIE...

THE SERVANTS ABANDONED JULIE AND HER NIECE FÉLICITÉ.




THE PAIR HAD TO MOVE FIVE TIMES IN THE THREE AND A HALF YEARS THEY STAYED IN COMPIÈGNE.




JULIE'S CONDITION BECAME WORSE. SHE COULD NO LONGER SPEAK.
